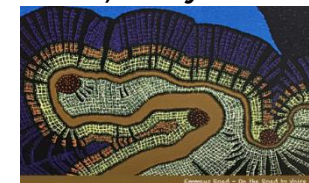

Book Review - The Voice To Parliament Handbook

All the detail you need on The Voice to Parliament is in this Handbook: the history; what it means for Australians; how the Voice can help to close the gap; the referendum and why vote 'Yes' and other frequently asked questions; and how you can help. Kerry O'Brien, multi-award winning Australian journalist and author did not 'hesitate to take up the invitation from Uluru Statement signatory Thomas Mayo to write this short, explanatory book with him on how the Voice might function, on why it would not subvert the parliamentary process in any way, but enhance and strengthen its integrity and, in the process, help make us whole as a nation' (page 15).
